Renée Reznek was born in South Africa. She graduated with a Bachelor of Music degree from the University of Cape Town where she studied with Lamar Crowson. She was then offered a scholarship to Carlo Zecchi's class at the Mozarteum in Salzburg, and subsequently went on a piano scholarship to study with Gyorgy Sandor at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor. There she completed Masters degrees in Piano Performance and Musicology.

Whilst undertaking doctoral research at Oxford University, Renée Reznek studied piano with Susan Bradshaw, making her London debut in the Park Lane Group's series, "Young Artists and Twentieth Century Music".

Renée's recitals of contemporary music have included many works written for her. These concerts have been mentioned in reviews of the best recitals of the year in London by the Financial Times and Music and Opera review.

Renée Reznek has played throughout Britain and abroad, recording for radio and South African television. She taught at Homerton College and St. John's College at Cambridge University for many years, and now lives in London.

Recent recitals have included several in London, Oxford, Cambridge, Harpenden and Southampton.
